Joe Rochioli Sparks Packers 18-6 Win

Joe Rochioli, Healdsburg High School senior, sparked the Prune Packers to an 18-6 victory over the San Francisco Fire Department Friday night at Recreation Park.

Rochioli, who is winding up his Greyhound athletic career as varsity pitcher and 3rd baseman has stepped from prep school ball to the faster pace of semi-pro baseball without a falter.

Inserted in the Friday night game at 3rd base in the 3rd inning, Rochioli went to bat for the first time in the 4th frame. With the bases loaded, the count 3 and 2 and the Packers trailing 3-0, the prep star drove the next pitch over the left field wall for a grand-slam home run, giving Healdsburg a lead which they did not relinquish throughout the remainder of the game.
