Packers Down Elks For 11th Straight Win

Lee Walker, lanky former Santa Rosa Junior College ace, won his mound duel against Bobby Blair of the Santa Rosa Elks Sunday night at Doyle Park to the tune of a 3-2 victory.

It was the Prune Packers 11th straight win this season, and their 5th straight Redwood Empire League victory.

Walker, scheduled to pitch against the Guadalupe Native Sons of San Francisco Friday night at Recreation Park, took over the mound Sunday when the Friday game was rained out.

Walker set the Elks down with 3 hits while striking out 14 and walking 3. Only 1 of Healdsburg's runs was earned.

The Packers scored twice in the 4th. Gus Suhr checked in on Ron La Pointe's ground ball after opening the inning with a double. Duane Herman's single brought La Pointe home.

The Santa Rosa Elks tied the game in their half of the 4th on two Packer errors and Blair's single.

Ron Moberg reached 2nd on Doug Camilli's hit into right field and came home with the winning run in the 5th when Gus Suhr made his third straight hit of the evening.

The Elks scored in the 1st inning when a single by Harry Deeths drove Chet Hamamoto home.

Suhr paced the hitters with 3 for 5, with Deeths leading the Elks' hitters with 2 for 4.
